to Government Code Section 56133

## Summary

This application was submitted by the County of San Mateo as governing body of the Scenic Heights County Sanitation District on behalf of the property owner pursuant to Government Code Section 56133. This provision requires Commission approval for extension of sewer or water service outside of jurisdictional boundaries. The application requests Commission approval for the Scenic Heights Sanitation District to extend sewer service to 1508 and 1510 Edgewood Road, currently served by a single inadequate septic system. Subject properties are contiguous to each other and 1510 Edgewood is adjacent to Cordilleras Creek. Approval is recommended.

### Departmental Reports

### Environmental Health:

The property receives water service from the California Water Service Company. The County of San Mateo Scenic Heights Sanitation District (Scenic), City of San Carlos and the City of Redwood City provide sewer service in the area. The property owner will be required to obtain an abandonment permit for the removal of the septic tank and meet all requirements of the Environmental Health Department.

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## San Mateo County Planning Division:

The County of San Mateo land use designation is Medium low-density residential, 2.4 to 6 dwelling units per acre. General Plan Policy 11.5 favors consideration of sewerage systems as the appropriate method of wastewater disposal in urban areas. General Plan Policy 11.5.b encourages the extension of sewerage system to serve unincorporated urban areas presently using individual sewage disposal system where warranted by public health concerns, environmental pollution or planned density of development.

## Scenic Heights County Sanitation District

The parcels will be served by the Scenic sewer main in Edgewood Road, which flows to the City of San Carlos. Sewer service will be provided by an outside sewer service agreement with the property owner. Treatment and transmission from Scenic is covered under a four party agreement between the City of San Carlos, the County of San Mateo, Scenic and Emerald Lake Heights Sewer Maintenance District which would be amended to provide this service. It is not anticipated that providing service to these two properties will affect existing and potential service or treatment capacity. The property owners will pay a sanitary sewer service charge equal to the charges levied to Scenic to cover the costs of maintenance, transmission and treatment as well as construction related costs.

Recommendation: Approve

## Discussion and Recommendation:

The San Mateo County Public Health and Environmental Health Division has found that the septic system serving both parcels is not operating properly and a permit for repair cannot be issued because Uniform Plumbing Code prohibits repair of septic systems that are within 200 feet of a public sewer main.

Properties in this area of Edgewood Road are in either the sphere of influence of the City of San Carlos or City of Redwood City with the sphere of influence boundary LAFCo File No. 05-07 November 9, 2005 Page 3

following the Cordilleras Creek and rear lot lines of properties on Edgewood Road. Sewer agencies in the area include Cities of San Carlos and Redwood City and the County-governed Scenic Sanitation and Emerald Lake Hills Sewer Maintenance Districts. In situations in which property owners request extension of sewer service because annexation is not possible, LAFCo staff directs property owners to the appropriate city whose sphere contains the subject parcel, which in this case is San Carlos.

In this situation, the City of San Carlos has an adopted outside sewer service policy that allows extension of service to properties in the City's sphere of influence and the City has sewage treatment capacity. However, the City will not maintain sewer mains if they are not located not in City streets.

For this reason, the property owner requests sewer service from the Scenic Sanitation District, which owns and operates the Hassler sewer line in Edgewood Road. The Hassler line transports effluent from County owned Cordilleras Center, surrounding unincorporated territory and territory in the City of San Carlos. Scenic Sanitation District has a zero sphere of influence with a determination that once properties are annexed the District would be dissolved.

Section 56133 permits approval of extension outside an agency's boundaries and outside the sphere of influence in order to respond to an existing or impending threat to public health or safety if documentation has been provided of public health or safety threat and the Commission has notified an alternative provider. As noted above, documentation has been provided that the septic system poses a public health threat and Public Health Officials request connection to a public sewer system. In addition, City of San Carlos, whose sphere contains the property was notified of the need for sewer service and indicates that it is willing to provide sewage treatment capacity if Scenic Sanitation extends service.

The Commission's policies for extension of service by agreement as permitted by Section 56133 direct that LAFCo staff shall encourage and assist the property owner in

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pursuing annexation prior to submitting a formal application for extension of services outside jurisdictional boundaries. In this case the parcels are not contiguous to the City of San Carlos and therefore not eligible for annexation at this time. Transfer of sewage treatment capacity by the City of San Carlos to Scenic and extension of sewer service by Scenic via a sewer main that serves property already in the City of San Carlos would facilitate annexation to the City of San Carlos when the property becomes contiguous.

Approval of sewer extension is recommended based on the failing septic system and recommendation from the Department of Environmental Health that the property connect to public sewer.

## Recommendation:

It is respectfully recommended that the Commission approve LAFCo File No. 05-07 and authorize the Scenic Heights County Sanitation District to provide sewer service by agreement to 1508 and 1510 Edgewood Road in unincorporated San Mateo County and authorize the Executive Officer to send a letter of approval.





Dear Mr. Gilbert

Panaka Chea, REHS, of San Mateo County Environmental Health (Health) inspected the septic system at 1508 and 1510 Edgewood Road last week. He did not find surfacing septic effluent. The system was previously inspected and pumped by A1 Septic Tank Service. They produced a report (attached) that indicates that the system does not work properly and is in need of repairs. Water was running from the leach fields to the tank and snaking the lines did not alleviate the problem.

There are only two possible interpretations of this information. The first is that the leach field trenches are becoming clogged with biomat (sludge) due to their age or excess water is being introduced into the leach fields either through water leaks in the home or by seasonal high ground water. Normally, I would require that this problem be elucidated by further work and appropriate repairs be made under a permit issued by Health. Since this a sewered area and there is a Public Sewer Main within 200 feet, the Unified Plumbing Code prohibits the issuance of a septic repair permit.

Since the existing septic system is not operating properly and therefore is a threat to public health, I am hereby requesting that the City of San Carlos make a connection to public sewer available for this property once the owner has paid all the appropriate fees.
