Strategy 1.2: build membership to include representatives from diverse backgrounds and capacities. Status: Outreach efforts were made and will be ongoing to recruit new members. Additional members to include are parents with lived experiences. As membership evolves, the committee can focus recruitment efforts on groups not yet represented at the table.

Review of FY 24-25 objectives

- Establishment and development of community pathway in preparation for the Families First Prevention Services Act
  - Movement from mandated reporting to community supporting and CAPC's involvement.
  - Significant amendments to child abuse reporting laws for general neglect
    - What qualifies as general neglect?
    - What will rise to the level of child welfare?
    - 50% of calls received are due to general neglect

How can CAPC be a catalyst for change with foreseen changes in California Law? CFS Director John Fong committed to bringing updates on changes in legislation and on current activities of the statewide task force.
